REMEMBERING ONE OF OUR OWN

Gennaro "Gerry" Pellegrini, Jr.

DOB 11/23/1975

KIA 8/9/2005

August 9, 2005 was the deadliest day for Pennsylvania soldiers in Operation Iraqi Freedom. On that day in two separate incidents, five members of the Pennsylvania National Guard serving in Iraq were killed. Among those killed that day were Spc. Gennaro Pellegrini Jr., 31, of Philadelphia, Pa. died in Bayji, Iraq, where a mine exploded and enemy forces attacked using small arms fire. He was assigned to the Army National Guard's 1st Battalion, 111th Infantry Regiment (Mechanized), Philadelphia, Pa. Gennaro, known as "Gerry" to his family and friends had been a Philadelphia Police Officer since 2001.



In 2004, his unit was called up for deployment to Iraq. He was an avid boxer, was 17-1 as an amateur and was Golden Gloves Champion in 1997. He fought in one professional fight at the Blue Horizon before his deployment. On May 21st, Gerry, a welterweight, squared off in a four-round fight against John Harris. Pelligrini won the fight with a dramatic KO in the fourth round. Pelligrini gave his camouflaged trunks to Blue Horizon owner Vernoca Michael with the promise that he would return from Iraq and wear them again. He didn't get to deliver on that promise. **(Continued on Page 4)**

While in Iraq, Gerry was in a pen-pal relationship with the children of the Horatio B. Hackett school in Fishtown. In one letter, he told the students how hard the war had been on the Iraqi children and described how many had to walk through the hot sand and broken glass with bare feet. The children took the initiative and collected 350 pairs of flip-flops and sent them to Gerry who was often mobbed as he tried to give them away.

As a Philadelphia Police Officer, Gerry was well liked and respected in Fishtown's 26th district. The son of a retired Philadelphia Police officer, Gerry wore his father's badge #3722. Fellow officers gave him the nickname "one-punch Gerry" after an altercation with a suspect. In that incident, a robbery on Delaware Avenue led to a car chase that ended at Chippendale and Frankford Avenues. The suspect threw two punches at Pellegrini before he was knocked out cold with one well-place shot.

Gerry is survived by his father and mother, Gennaro senior and Edith Pellegrini, and his two sisters, Dana and Kimberly.

On the last Thursday of each month at 2PM, Washington's Crossing National Cemetery in Newtown, Bucks County holds a ceremony for all veterans who have died during the month but had no one attending their burial. The ceremony includes full Military Honors and a folded flag is presented to a volunteer on behalf of those who died. Everyone deserves to have someone at the end: to have their name spoken and their lives and service honored and memorialized. The cemetery is located at 830 Highland Rd., Newtown, PA. Please think about attending if you can.

The bus will then return to the Oxley Post.

Our ceremony at the post will begin at approximately 2:30 PM. Please join us as we remember all our brothers and sisters who made the ultimate sacrifice. We'll be firing up the grill after the ceremony.

Once again, we're asking all Oxley Family members to bring in any photos, medals, awards or other memorabilia from their loved ones who have served – or are serving. All materials will be returned. Please don't drop off anything prior to Memorial Day as we don't want to misplace any of your keepsakes.
